

One of the Home's most important services is our adoption program. Our aim is to place our animals into loving homes with well-prepared and informed owners.



YOUR RESPONSIBILITIES AFTER ADOPTION

- Firstly, thoroughly read the accompanying dog or cat care booklet;
- Ensure that your pet's desexing stitches are removed 10 - 14 days after surgery. Stitch removal is performed free of charge at The Lost Dogs' Home Vet Hospital. Please check the date on your pet's desexing certificate; and
- Ensure you maintain the vaccinations of your pet. An initial vaccination has been provided to your pet at the time of desexing, a booster vaccination will be required four weeks after this date and then annually for your pet's life.

YOUR HEALTH COVER

The pet you are adopting has been examined by one of our veterinarians and has been found to be appropriate for rehoming. However, an animal's health status can change over time.

The Lost Dogs' Home offers limited health cover for one week from the date of purchase. This health cover relates to diseases that are related to your new pets stay at The Lost Dogs' Home.

To be eligible for the cover, your new pet must be brought back to The Lost Dogs' Home Vet Hospital for examination and you must bring all paperwork with you.

Please ring the clinic for an appointment. The Lost Dog's Home is unable to cover the costs associated with veterinary care at any other veterinary clinics.

Your health cover includes respiratory disease (canine cough in puppies or dogs and cat flu in kittens or cats), and gastroenteritis. It also includes any complications related to desexing surgery.

The Lost Dogs' Home Vet Hospital will waive the consultation fees during the first week. The Veterinarian will discuss any treatments with you. **It is your responsibility to pay for any medications that may be prescribed.**

If your adopted pet is ill or unacceptable to you for any reason during this cover period, you can return the animal for a full refund of the purchase price.

HEALTH SYMPTOMS TO WATCH FOR: ALL PETS

Gastroenteritis including vomiting and diarrhoea. If the pet is listless, or has diarrhoea with persistent vomiting.

Surgery complications excessive swelling, redness or a discharge at the surgical site as well as self-trauma (licking or chewing). This requires treatment. If any of these symptoms are apparent please call The Lost Dogs' Home Vet Hospital.

DOG AND PUPPIES

Canine Cough Signs of canine cough include a dry, hacking cough. It is a highly contagious disease of dogs and puppies. If your dog loses its appetite while suffering from canine cough or develops a discharge from the eyes or nose, you should contact The Lost Dogs' Home Vet Hospital.

CATS AND KITTENS

Respiratory disease (cat flu) Signs of cat flu include sneezing, coughing, snuffled breathing and runny eyes. It is a contagious disease of cats and kittens. If your cat develops these signs and becomes listless, loses its appetite, won't drink, is very blocked up in its breathing or has an eye irritation, you should contact The Lost Dogs' Home Vet Hospital.
