1910s

The Temporary Home for Lost and Starving Dogs is officially opened on 28 February 1913 thanks to the generosity of the animal-loving Victorian community. 1920s

The Home becomes
the place of safe keeping
for all lost dogs in
Melbourne and is one
of the first places in
Australia to offer lost
animals for adoption.

1930s

The Home's first
animal hospital caring
for sick and injured
lost pets, is opened
on 27 May 1935 by the
Governor-General at the
time, Sir Isaac Isaacs.

1960s

By the time we enter this decade more than 19,000 lost pets are being cared for by the Home each year – including more than 3,000 cats.

1970s

A group of influential young businesswomen calling themselves 'The Strays' banded together to boost the Home's profile and raise much-needed funds to keep the Home open.

1980s

A media campaign launched by the Home highlights the problems of irresponsible pet ownership. A Parliamentary Inquiry then recommends compulsory microchipping for pets.

1990s

The Home launches the National Pet Register, a free pet tag service, helping to make sure that as many cats and dogs as possible can be reunited with their lost families.

After two months in our Behaviour Program, working with her trainer Erin, Sunny's life completely turned around. Responding to our positive rewards-based training, her stress melted away and she became a happier, more confident dog.

At the end of her behaviour training, Sunny was adopted by Stephen, a confirmed animal lover, who likes nothing better than to play with her all the time and has lots of space for her to run around. Sunny is now living the good life in her new home.

"She is a very happy dog and I'm very happy too," Stephen says. "I absolutely love her company and the unconditional love she gives to me in return."

The Lost Dogs' Home supports our Foster Carer volunteers with pet food, cat litter, toys, blankets, animal behaviour support and foster carer counselling.
